- Continuously hold registration with the Chinese Medicine Board of Australia;
- Continuously hold a current First Aid Certificate (HLTAID011);
- Belong to one of the professional associations referred to in the table below and adhere to the membership requirements for that association;
- Meet the training and education requirements set out in the table below (providers who are currently recognised and have been continuously recognised since before 1 July 2009 are deemed to meet our training and education requirements);
- Comply with Terms and Conditions for HCF Recognised Providers of Extras Services as amended from time to time.
