

RECOGNITION REQUIREMENTS FOR PROVIDERS OF CHINESE HERBAL MEDICINE

Please apply for recognition through your professional association.

Chinese Herbal Medicine practitioners must meet the following requirements:

- Continuously hold registration with the Chinese Medicine Board of Australia;
- Continuously hold a current First Aid Certificate (HLTAID003);
- Belong to one of the professional associations referred to in the table below and adhere to the membership requirements for that association;
- Meet our training and education requirements for the profession in which they seek recognition (providers who are currently recognised and have been continuously recognised since before 1 July 2009 are deemed to meet our training and education requirements);
- Comply with Terms and Conditions for HCF Recognised Providers of General Treatment as amended from time to time which are downloadable from www.hcf.com.au/pdf/general/Terms_and_Conditions_for_Recognised_Providers_of_General_Treatment.pdf

RECOGNITION REQUIREMENTS FOR PROVIDERS OF CHINESE HERBAL MEDICINE

If you have qualified overseas:

HCF accepts qualifications attained outside Australia when:

- The overseas qualification is a bachelor degree level qualification AND
- The overseas qualification has been assessed as being at least equivalent to an Australian bachelor degree in Acupuncture by Vetassess (www.vetassess.com.au/) (Qualifications from China must also be assessed as 'genuine' qualifications by Vetassess) AND
- The qualification is substantially equivalent to an HCF approved bachelor degree in acupuncture (including duration, content, and clinical practice) AND
- The course has not been substantially delivered via distance/external/on-line mode and includes an appropriate level of supervised clinical practice.

We also accept an AACMA clinical assessment of your overseas bachelor degree and non AACMA members can contact the AACMA to discuss this service and fees.
